Responsibilities

The Small Animal Oncology Residency Program is a 40 months program designed to provide advanced clinical training in oncology, internal medicine and related fields. This program will permit the resident to achieve the requirements established by the European College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (ECVIM-CA, Oncology) for board certification. The resident will be expected to study towards the European Diploma in Veterinary Oncology.

The Oncology service serves as a referral center for small animal cancer patients but also sees primary cases. The service also offers daily radiation therapy with a linear accelerator on site. The residents will participate in primary patient care (including general emergency duties), daily rounds, journal clubs, seminars and clinical conferences. The resident will also be involved in clinical teaching of students and interns.

A major portion of the residency will be spent on clinical rotations with oncologists and internists. The resident is further expected to complete at least one research project resulting in a manuscript suitable for publication, and to present the research at an international meeting. Personal development time is provided for this and to study for boards.

- Appointments will be made for 12 months with annual renewal based on satisfactory completion of the previous year.

Necessary knowledge and qualifications

- Applicants must have successfully completed a 12-month rotating internship or must have gained equivalent experience. Further, candidates need to have sufficient knowledge of the German and English language to communicate with clients and to pass the certifying exam.
- Applications should include a letter of intent, curriculum vitae, exam transcripts, veterinary licensing documentation, internship diploma, and at least two letters of recommendation. An interview is strongly encouraged but not required.
